Where Will Your Cost-of-Living Adjustment Land in 2025?

After a slow start to the fiscal year, the index which will set the cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) for military retirees, Social Security recipients, and others has risen sharply in recent months, and now outpaces last year's inflation track.

Should this trend continue, retirees could expect a higher adjustment than the 3.2% received in 2024. However, one recent estimate puts the 2025 figure at 2.6%, well short of the last three adjustments – 3.2%, 8.7%, and 5.9% – but not far from the average adjustment over the last 10 years (2.75%).

Major MOAA-Backed Improvements for Troops, Families Part of Initial NDAA Bill

A series of reforms and new programs designed to improve the lives of servicemembers and their families moved from a panel report to the text of legislation in just a few short days, thanks in part to a bipartisan effort relying on input from military advocacy groups including MOAA.

The base text of the House version of the FY 2025 National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) will include recommendations from the House Armed Services Committee's Quality of Life Panel, a bipartisan group whose plans to address a series of challenges faced by the all-volunteer force include several MOAA priorities.

Among the improvements: Pay raises for junior enlisted and programs targeting persistent issues with child care, health care, and spouse employment.
